For over 35 years, Neighbor to Neighbor has been a place where neighbors come together to help each other. From providing clothing to those in the greater Greenwich area, to providing weekly food to those in Greenwich, families have come to count on us in their time of need. Neighbor's mission is to provide these basic living essentials in an atmosphere of dignity and respect. We accomplish this by utilizing the "choice" method to distribute food and clothing, by providing nutritious items such as fresh produce and lowfat milk and by using caring volunteers to assist as needed. This November saw a record increase in the number of families qualified to receive food, with 470 families in Greenwich now eligible. Last year, a record year, nearly 300,000 meals were provided to those in need. In addition, more than 16,000 bags of clothing were given out. Neighbor relies on donations of food, clothing, volunteer time and funding to provide for our neighbors. We are truly grateful to the community for making our work possible.
